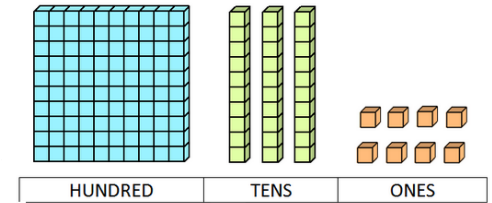

The Celts (Britain in the Iron Age)



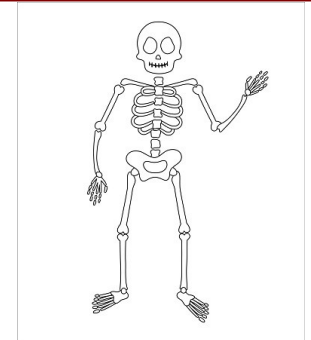
During Autumn 2, pupils in Year 3 will be learning about:

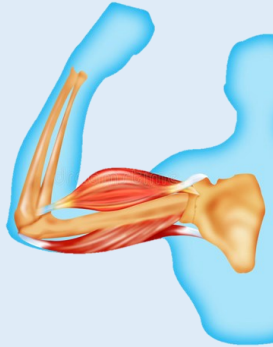

Fun activities to try at home

Science— Humans and animals

During science in Autumn 1, we explore skeletons and their functions, compare different types of skeletons and the role muscles play in how humans and animals move.



At home you could:

- Discuss with your children what your body is doing when completing different activities. It doesn't have to be sport; what do your bones and muscles do when you get up out of bed?
- Research different animals and what skeletons they have. What do the words, exoskeleton, endoskeleton and hydrostatic skeletons mean?
- Are you able to find out any of the names of the bones in the body? How many bones are there?

Key vocabulary to use with your child:

Skeletons, muscles, endoskeleton, hydrostatic skeleton, exoskeleton, invertebrate, vertebrate

History—The Celts

Here are some ideas of activities children may like to try at home to further develop their history learning:

- Research about the Celts or any famous Celts. Can you create a fact file or poster to share with your class and teacher?
- Your child could find out about the different battles. Were the Celts good warriors?
- What was Wode? Why was wattle and daub important for the Celts?
- How was life different in Celtic Britain from our lives today? Can you name 10 differences?
