Fun activities to try at home

Science— Nutrition

There are lots different activities that your child can do at home to link into our unit on nutrition. Nutrients are things that humans and animals need to keep healthy. We can find nutrients in the foods that we eat.

You could try:

- Cook with your child and talk about the different ingredients. What food category are they in? What makes the meal you are preparing a balanced diet?
- Keep a food diary as a family. What types of foods are most popular? What effect is this having on your bodies?
 i.e. carbohydrates will give you a slow release of energy.
- When out and about, talk about the different animals you see. What food do they eat? What type of diet do they have?
