English

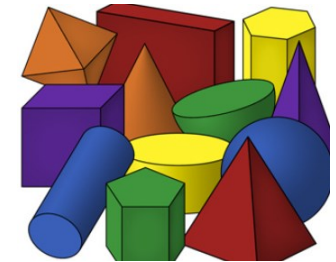

Fun activities to try at home

Science— Rocks and Soils

In school, we look at different types of rocks and compare them based on the characteristics they hold. We explore how fossils are made and then create our own fossil. We then investigate soil and how it is formed. We explore the permeability of different types of soil and how this affects the types of plants that can grow.



Ideas to try at home:

- Make your own rock—Use ingredients that are easy to have on hand. All you need is glue, sand, pebbles and a disposable cup.
- Can you explore the soil in your garden, local park or do you have any potted plants at home?

History—The Anglo Saxon Invasions

In school, we put the Anglo Saxon events in chronological order so that the children understand that they came to Britain after the Celts and Romans. We compare what Anglo Saxon settlements were like. We also explore how they lived and what they believed.
